





This week our coveted helmet award is being given to a teacher who demonstrates the warrior charism of being **Wise**.



Please feel free to use a thank you note template below or create your own! Please have your child drop the completed note into a collection


box that will be set up in the entrance of the school. PTSU members will deliver the notes to our community caregivers. **We will be** collecting notes the week of 3/22/21.

This week's #ThrowbackThursday Alumni spotlight features Amanda Guzzo, IWA Class of 1996!

After IWA, Amanda attended Magnificat High School and graduated in 2000. She received her bachelor's degree in Art Education from Kent State University and a master's degree in Education in Curriculum and Instruction in Art Education from Cleveland State University. Upon completion of her master's degree, Amanda became an adjunct professor at Cleveland State University, teaching methods classes for students majoring in art education and teaching an arts integration class for students majoring in early childhood education and special education.

Amanda is in her 16th year of teaching and currently teaches at Parma Senior High School where she's been teaching for the last 7 years. She is also the coach for the high school color guard and serves on the building forum team, helping to find solutions for issues that arise in the school. Amanda runs the art club with a fellow art teacher, and she will soon be helping to write the new art curriculum for the three high schools in the Parma City School District.

Amanda is a licensed PreK-12 teacher in visual arts and has teaching experience in various school types. Prior to her time at Parma Senior High School, Amanda spent three years at both Assumption Academy and St. Joseph School in Amherst. She then spent time at a charter school in Cleveland where she served as the head of the art department and art club advisor.

When asked about memories of her time spent at IWA and with the Sisters, Amanda had many to share. "I remember helping raise a baby chick named Plucky in Sr. Therese's 3rd grade class, and I use Sr. Elizabeth's math song regularly! I enjoyed our field trip to Stan Hewitt Hall in 7th grade, and it has become one of my favorite places to visit because of that trip." She also enjoyed making, presenting and competing in science fairs, playing on the basketball and softball teams, Sr. Joan's hilarious personality, being a part of


