Praise Be Our Incarnate Word







ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT Jayne Collins '57



This week's **#ThrowbackThursday** alumni spotlight features Jayne (LaSalvia) Collins, IWA Class of 1957!

After graduating from IWA, Jayne attended Nazareth Academy and graduated in 1961. She then attended Notre Dame College and earned a bachelor of arts in 1965, and afterward attended John Carroll University, taking courses in Eastern European and Russian Studies. She earned her Master of Arts in American Studies in 1986 from Fairfield University in Fairfield, CT.

Jayne's two brothers, Robert LaSalvia '62, and Richard LaSalvia '67, also attended and graduated from IWA. Jayne's three children grew up in Connecticut and graduated from The University of Notre Dame.

Jayne recently retired after 30 years of teaching History and serving as the Upper School Head at Convent of the Sacred Heart school in Greenwich, CT. Before moving to Connecticut in 1974, she taught English and History at Magnificat High School and Ursuline Academy. In all, Jayne has given over 45 years of service to Catholic education!

Jayne says her parents Kathleen and Frank LaSalvia were great supporters of IWA, and that she and her brothers were the recipients of an outstanding moral

and academic education from the Sisters of the Incarnate Word. "I was a graduate of IWA because of the sacrifices made by my parents. As a student, I was blessed to be taught by Sr. Mary Gabriel, Sr. Mary Jane, Sr. Mary Raphael, Sr. Mary Peter, Sr. Mary Patricia and Sr. Mary Sebastian. They were my spiritual, academic and personal mentors, and I have always endeavored to carry forth their inspiration with my own children and students. It is remarkable that generations of young girls and boys continue to be inspired and educated because of the legacy of the Sisters of the Incarnate Word who arrived from Ireland via Mexico. Their words and vision live on in all the students whose lives they've touched!"
