


A MESSAGE FROM OUR ADMINISTRATIVE TEAM

We will increase engagement of our school families, alums, donors, and the regional community by providing unique opportunities to connect with Incarnate Word Academy.


Preserving the Legacy of the Sisters of the Incarnate Word

into the learning and community of Incarnate Word Academy.



CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHTS

Two weeks ago, I shared an email with the IWA community that one of my family members tested positive for Covid. Following the guidance from our Board of Health, we quarantined for 14 days. Fortunately, no one in my household developed serious symptoms. We were truly blessed.

With our school's new technology, I was able to attend meetings with our faculty and parents while remaining home. I also had the privilege of walking in the shoes of an OC Learner! I joined various Google Meets and had the opportunity to be a part of the classrooms virtually. One of my visits took me to Ms. Medalis's 5th grade honors math class and their Escape Room challenge. Students, working in pairs, used critical thinking skills to solve various expressions involving decimals. In order to escape, the students had to successfully solve problems to unlock several levels. The problems were progressively more challenging as they advanced levels.

What I enjoyed most was watching how successful the class operated, and how the students interacted with one another. Mrs. Medalis seamlessly placed the students into groups, regardless if a child was in person or at home. The students knew how to join virtual groups and even reminded Ms. Medalis to mute her speaker once they began to work. All of the students were on task, engaged, challenged, and having fun solving math expressions. Thank you, Ms. Medalis and her 5th grade honors math class for allowing me to be a part of your class as an OC Learner!

ATTENDANCE REMINDERS

Thank you to all parents for your communication as we transition to both in-person and off-campus instruction. Now, more than ever, your communication and partnership is essential.

We wanted to provide a few reminders on our updated attendance procedures:

Parents need to call the office when:

- 1. FTF or VR learner are going to be absent for the entire day
- 2. Face to face students going to be late or leaving early for appointments. *FTF students are still required to be signed out by a parent at the school office before leaving.
- 3. VR learners are logging in late or logging off for appointment

In the event you leave a message at 440-842-6818 ext. 305, please include the reason for the absence. The office will contact you if you do not report your child late/absent and a teacher reports the absence. Please do not email a teacher without including the office. The office notifies not only your child's homeroom teacher but also the special teachers of the absence.

*Requests for missing work/books are only being taken at the office after 3 consecutive days of being absent. After 3 days, a Doctor's note is also needed to return to face to face learning.

COOL WEATHER REMINDERS

Please check that your children are properly dressed for the weather outside daily. **All students enjoy 20 minutes of outdoor recess** and <u>may not stay inside if they do not have a jacket or coat.</u>

Classroom temperatures will also fluctuate during the seasons. Solid maroon, gray and white sweaters are permitted for both boys and girls. Any IWA spirit wear sweatshirts are allowed to be worn to & from school or during outdoor recess; however, they must be taken off in school.
